- *At least 50% of students will attend 95% or more of school days, and no more than 15% of students will attend less*
- *Decrease the overall number of all students will score Below Basic on the Math PSSA/Reading PSSA*
- *At least 75% of students will earn As and Bs in all core courses on Report Cards.*

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

John B Stetson Middle School will:

- Provide workshops on effective report card conferences and progress monitoring so parents are able to stay informed about their child's success and where support is needed.
- Meet and greet with the principal will be held with parents
- Open house/Back to School Night including Annual Title I Meeting and School Advisory Council
- Parents are trained on using the home components of interventions
- Provide Report Card Conferences three times per year and Interim Reports
- We will increase Professional Development opportunities for all staff to ensure the implementation of effective teaching strategies in order for all students to become proficient learners
- We will provide interventions for learners performing below grade level in Reading and Mathematics. Interventions include Achieve3000 and IReady. (OCT 3rd)
- We will assure that students are able to work in a safe and nurturing environment and do so in a supportive and effective learning environment.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Create a home environment that supports learning
- Monitor student attendance and tardiness, excused and unexcused absences.
- Participate in classroom workshops to gain knowledge of curriculum and become familiar with strategies used to support student learning.
- Encourage our children to read often
- Ensure that our children report to school daily, on time, nourished, and well-rested
- Review assignments and encourage our children to complete all homework
- Review all school communications and respond promptly
- Attend school activities and all parent conferences
- Encourage our child to show respect towards school personnel, his/her classmates and school property
- Attend classroom trips, assemblies and school-wide celebrations and events.
- Participate in decision making as related to the education of our children
- Attend parent workshops
